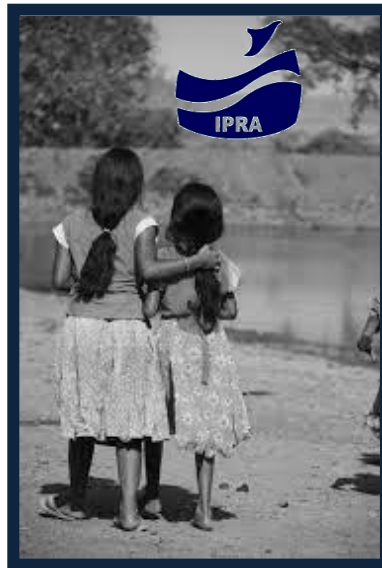

IPRA Beneficiaries

In this year (April 2021 to March 2022), IPRA has registered 200 street children.



On an average daily 30 children (3-6 years) gathered at our centre for NFE. Prepared for Formal Education with Government Schools.

We have provided throughout that year Nutritious meals, which help poor children concentrate in NFE class and help in eliminating classroom hunger.

Having fun & interactive learning sessions does improve learning on the whole and engender a positive attitude toward learning.



That's why we arranged dance sessions for the kids on several occasions this year.

PRIMARY HEALTH CARE SERVICE (OPD)

The camp was held at the J.J. Cluster, Indira Camp, Hasanpur, Delhi.

Patients were screened for vision and other eye abnormalities.

The cases were attended by the team of – Dr Praveen Verma, Optometrist.

CAMP STATISTICS

- Total patients covered during the camp – 150 (40 children and 110 adults)
- Identified for glasses – 137
- Identified for cataract surgeries – 4
- Glasses need to be given to students and adults identified for defective vision
- Those needing surgical intervention need to be operated. The medical social worker of the unit to speak with patients and parents of the children/students and counsel them for surgery/treatment
- Follow-up for other patients to be done



We are extremely proud to claim that Sunil Kumar has returned home after a long treatment. This would have been impossible without the cooperation of the incomparable donors and our penance.
